Grade Eight Geography Unit A Part 1 Human Settlement and Physical Environment



In what ways can the environment affect human settlement?

We will need to discover:

- · Why do we live in the places we do?
- How does the environment impact the ways in which we live?

In our first geography unit, students will explore the patterns of human settlement and will begin to think critically about the relationship between the physical environment and human habitations. Students will focus on where people live and why they live there, and will begin to explore the impact of human settlement and land use on the environment.

Students will develop critical thinking, research and inquiry skills and will apply a geographic perspective to their investigation of human settlement, quality of life, equity, power and authority and stewardship. Students will explore case studies that examine a variety of physical landscapes (mountainous, desert, ocean, plains, volcanic, etc.) and their human inhabitants (including First Nations communities, ancient towns and modern cities).

Students will complete the unit with a personal research study and critical examination of a human settlement and its relationship with the physical environment.
